



Community Benefits from Project

70% of jobs from local Central Coast-Lake Macquarie region

The company that owns the Wallarah 2 coal project, the Wyong Areas Coal Joint Venture, has targeted around 70% of the workforce for the mine to be sourced from the local region and the remainder to be experienced mineworkers from other mining areas such as other NSW coalfields and other Australian mining centres.

In addition, as many as 700 flow-on jobs could be created on the Central Coast to support the 300 directly to be employed at the mine.

Diverse range of direct and indirect jobs

Those jobs will be in areas that supply products and services to the mine and would be as diverse as light and heavy engineering and manufacturing, plant and equipment maintenance, retail and wholesale suppliers, construction trades and professionals, contractors, fuel and oil supplies, vehicles sales and servicing, computer, telecommunications and office supplies.

\$100 M per year to local economy

It is estimated that about \$100 million on top of wages would flow annually to the regional economy, of which \$60 million per annum will be expended in the Central Coast economy.

Mining companies in NSW spend more than \$1 billion a year on local and regional suppliers. Collectively they also contribute more than \$5 million a year for amenities in the communities amongst whom they operate.

On top of this, hundreds of millions of dollars are paid annually by mining companies in Federal and State taxes and charges.
