



Community Trust -

a partnership for funding local projects

The Wyong Areas Coal Joint Venture intends to create to a Community Trust through which it will ensure that many more direct benefits flow to the local community than is generally required under project approval conditions.

Community members will be aware that major projects are usually required to provide what are known as Section 94 Contributions, which is funding for projects identified by the local authorities, in this case, Wyong Council.

The company will honour those contributions, of course, when approval is granted but the company believes there is more it can do. There are many other benefits, particularly economic, including about 700 additional indirect jobs that will flow from approval for the project.

There are successful models for community trusts in other parts of NSW and while we are examining those we would welcome comment and input from the Wyong community on how the Trust could be established, how it might operate and who might

be best to serve on the Trust to administer the Trust.

The Trust will provide millions of dollars into the community so sound structures and procedures are needed.

If you have any ideas they would be most welcome. Funds from similar trusts have enabled communities to develop services and facilities that otherwise might not be possible so in offering your comments please do not feel constrained. Areas you might consider could include education, welfare, community recreation, community health, economic development and employment generation.

We would welcome your input by the end of April 2007.
